- Maintain RACV as a mutually owned membership organisation advocating for environmentally sustainable mobility for all Victorians, be that car, bike or public transport.
- We endorse the \$38 billion Victorian Transport Plan but more of it should be funded and additions are needed, such as building the East-West road tunnel.
- Lobby for Victoria to receive its 25% per capita share of federal road funding to help deliver the Eddington vision, plus better regional and outer metropolitan roads.
- Keep Victorian roads close to the safest in the world through advocacy on issues such as roads and public transport investment, P-plate graduated licensing and new in-vehicle child restraint regulations.
- Continuing to improve roadside member benefits through programs such as years of membership discounts and the show your card and save program.
- Continue roadside member entitlement to access expanding RACV resort network such as Royal Pines on the Gold Coast, Cape Schanck, Inverloch, Torquay and Cobram.
- Lobby for lower motorist tax burden and removal of unfair imposts, such as GST on petrol excise, through Henry tax review process.
