Methodology

- 1,000 telephone interviews
- Nationally representative sample
- Data was weighted by age, sex and location to reflect actual population distribution
- Field work: 26th 30th November 2008
- Where applicable, comparisons to results of the previous study (19th – 26th April 2008) are included
- Maximum margin of error at 95% confidence level: ±3.1%



Summary

Summary

- Despite the international financial crisis, the general mood amongst Australians is still positive.
- The Olympics were well received and contributed to a significant opinion shift.
- Since the Olympics, Australians' opinion of China has dramatically improved. They are now more positive towards China than the United States or Russia.
- Attitudes towards foreign investment remain positive and stable.
- Opposition to Chinese investment in Australian has significantly dropped.
- Attitudes to Chinese investment are now positive, having increased significantly since April.


Summary

- There is a significant increase in support for a long-term plan for Australia and China to co-ordinate investment in mineral resources.
- We still see strong support for a free trade agreement with China.
- The jobs that could be provided by Chinese investments are of increasing importance.
- And finally, Australians are less concerned about the Chinese form of government.




Favourability ratings

China trend line






China – Regional Demographics








Olympics improved China's image




Less concern about Chinese form of government


