Sex Party with a chance

THE Sex Party will pick up preferences from the Liberals in the upper house electorate of Northern Metropolitan region in one of the oddest deals of the state election.

Group voting tickets show both Liberal and Labor supporters who vote above the line will be giving their preferences, and possibly a seat in the upper house, to the Sex Party's founder Fiona Patten.

The Sex Party was founded in 2008 in response to concerns about religion in politics.

Monash University political commentator Nick Economou said the Liberal's preference deal with the Sex Party was strange, though Labor might be trying to prove to the public and the media it was not interested "playing preference games with the Greens"

He said with 93 per cent of all upper house votes cast above the line, group deals were vital.

"Both parties have had internal heartache about what to do with their preferences," Dr Economou said. "Maybe Labor is trying to demonstrate their unhappiness with the Greens.'

He said there was a possibility the leg up from both major parties could give the Sex Party the 16.6 per cent needed to win a seat.

He predicted Labor would win at least two of the five seats, with one going to the Liberals and another to the Greens.

"Labor might get as high as 48 per cent and possibly three seats." he said.

Dr Economou said Parents, Families and Carers Party candidate Joanne Stuart had an outside chance of picking up the fifth seat with early preferences from Greens, the Sex Party, the DLP, Families First, Labor and independents.

Meanwhile independent Stephen Mayne says 1.5 per cent of the vote would be enough to get him over the line.
